

Brussels Privacy Hub (BPH) & International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) jointly publish Handbook on Data Protection and Humanitarian Action

The Handbook addresses questions that arise in applying data protection to international humanitarian action. It is aimed at staff of international humanitarian organisations and NGOs who are involved in the processing of personal data, particularly those in charge of advising on and applying data protection standards. The Hub hopes it will also prove useful to other parties, such as data protection authorities, private companies and others involved in international humanitarian action.
